Notification of emergency measures

Recently, a number of dangerous viral and bacterial plant diseases have been detected in imported plant products in the region and neighboring countries. For this reason, the Republic of Azerbaijan will apply the following temporary phytosanitary measures starting from August 20, 2021 until new phytosanitary import requirements are prepared in accordance with paragraph 1 of Article VII of the International Plant Protection Convention and item 13.2.2 of the "Law on Phytosanitary Control" of the Republic of Azerbaijan":

- 1. Regarding to imported tomatoes (*Solanum lycopersicum LYPES*) seeds and seedlings, the following statement should be made in section of "Additional declaration" of the phytosanitary certificate for export:
 - "The consignment was tested and found free from Tomato brown rugose fruit virus (TOBRFV), Pepino mosaic virus (PEPMV0), Tomato spotted wilt virus (TSWV00) and Tomato yellow leaf curl virus (TYLCV0)". The original test protocol which contains the laboratory test results (real time PCR) confirming this statement (in English or Russian) must be accompanied by a phytosanitary certificate.
- 2. Regarding to imported pepper (*Capsicum annuum CPSAN*) seeds and seedlings, the following statement should be made in section of "Additional declaration" of the phytosanitary certificate for export:
 - "The consignment was tested and found free from *Tomato brown rugose fruit virus* (*TOBRFV*), Pepino mosaic virus (PEPMV0) və Ralstonia solanacearum (RALSSL)". The original test protocol which contains the laboratory test results (real time PCR) confirming this statement (in English or Russian) must be accompanied by a phytosanitary certificate.
- 3. Regarding to imported seed and ware potatoes (*Solanum tuberosum SOLTU*), the following statement should be made in section of "Additional declaration" of the phytosanitary certificate for export:
 - "The consignment was tested and found free from Ralstonia solanacearum (RALSSL), Clavibacter sepedonicus (CORBSE), Synchytrium endobioticum (SYNCEN) and Globodera rostochiensis (HETDRO)". In the case of seed potatoes, the original test protocol which contains the laboratory test results confirming this statement (in English or Russian) must be accompanied by a phytosanitary certificate.
