

Вимоги до експорту продуктів переробки птахівництва з України до США

Перший етап при здійсненні експорту продуктів переробки птахівництва - звернення імпортера в США до apie@usda.gov на отримання import permit.

Під вантаж видається import permit, в якому зазначаються вимоги до експорту. Вимоги можуть відрізнятись для кожного вантажу та продукції.

Імпорт матеріалу до США може регулюватися багатьма агенціями США, включно з USDA APHIS, Управлінням з контролю за продуктами й ліками (FDA), Службою охорони рибних ресурсів і дикої природи США (FWS) та іншими. Імпортер із США також повинен зв'язатися з FDA та FWS (і будь-якими іншими відповідними агентствами).

Requirements from Animal Product Import and Export (APIE)

Materials for animal consumption (such as pet food/chew/treats or animal feed) and most animal byproducts containing livestock material, poultry material, or rendered meals/digests/hydrolysates (or similar) from any animal (including fish/shellfish) require that the responsible importer located in the United States or who operates a business in the United States apply for and obtain a United States Veterinary Permit to Import. The U.S. importer should email apie@usda.gov for information on how to apply for an import permit.

This import permit will specify the animal health certifications that must accompany each shipment of permitted material. The requirements for the permit (and subsequent certificate) will depend on the ingredients of the material/product, as well as the heat or processing treatments used. As these products can contain many different ingredients, each permit is unique to the importer's application. The official veterinarian of the exporting government must review each import permit to verify the certificate requirements.

Also, depending on the ingredients listed in the material imported into the U.S., a Facility Inspection Checklist (completed by an official veterinarian of the exporting government) may or may not be required. When a Checklist is required, more information regarding the Checklist will be provided to the U.S. importer during the permit application process. A Checklist is required when the materials imported into the U.S. (for animal consumption) contain a processed animal protein, such as a rendered meal, digest, hydrolysate, most animal origin powders, other rendered material, or other similar materials.

Requirements from FDA

Regarding [Importing Animal Food](#). Animal feed is food made for animals and includes pet food, pet treats, food for farm animals, and medicated feed. For medicated feed, please note that Type A medicated articles are regulated as animal drugs and Type B/C medicated articles are regulated as animal feed containing a drug.

1. **Ensure product is compliant with all FDA laws, regulations, and policy/guidance.**

2. **Check FDA's [Import Alerts](#) to determine if your product/manufacture is subject to Detention without Physical Examination (DWPE) and requirements to secure a release of the shipment.**
3. **Review [FDA's Entry Submission and Review Process](#).**

4. **Consider providing the following information to your Customs broker to transmit to FDA.** Complete and accurate information and documentation will help expedite the review process.
- Product name(s) and/or descriptions (might be listed on commercial invoice)
 - Intended use of the product(s) in the U.S.
 - Name and address of the physical location of the manufacturer, shipper, importer, and the deliver to party.
 - If any of the entities have an [FEI](#) or [D-U-N-S number](#), they may optionally be supplied.

What to Consider During the Import Process

1. **Stay in contact** with your Customs broker and/or FDA and provide requested information in a timely manner.
 - a. If FDA requests documents or an inspection, provide the requested information and/or documents via [ITACS](#).
 - i. Documents might include invoices, shipping documents, ingredients list, copies of labels, photos of product, formulations, processing methods, etc.
 - ii. You may provide any information that would help the reviewer determine your product is in compliance with U.S. laws and regulations.
2. **Monitor the status** of your entry on [ITACS](#) for final admissibility decision.
3. **Submit questions** about your shipment to the [local FDA office](#) at the port of entry.
